## Course Description

This is a one semester postgraduate course which will focus on substantive issues of European Union (EU) External Relations Law with emphasis on the EU Common Security and Defence Policy. The course focuses on the EU policies towards third countries and their association relations with the EU. Students are expected to possess a basic knowledge on institutional and constitutional fundamentals of the EU. Participants of the course will investigate the political

and legal rationale behind EU external policies. The first part of the course deals with history of the EU external policies and relations between the EU and international public law. The second part of the course focuses on the legal fundamentals of the EU external competences (expressed, mixed, and implied). The third part of the course studies selected external policies of the EU and relevant contractual arrangements with third countries (association, partnership, neighbourhood). The fourth part of the course looks at the EU-Ukraine relations and related policies (European Neighbourhood Policy, Eastern Partnership, Arctic cooperation, EU-US, EU-China relations and other).

## Teaching Methods

The class will follow a traditional continental teaching format (lecture followed by an open format workshop/tutorial). Some material will be presented in a lecture format. However, most of the classes will combine both lectures and tutorials. Students will be expected to contribute their own ideas (based on the assigned reading, latest news on the EU affairs and/or own investigation on particular issues) during lectures and, especially, during workshops/tutorials, wherein students will be encouraged to perform individual presentations on issues related to the topics of the course. Due to a limited number of workshops/tutorials it is recommended for willing students to sign up as soon as possible for a presentation on the topic of their interest within the scope of the course.

## Expected Outcomes

On successful completion of the course students will be expected to: 1. Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the major legal and political foundations of the EU external policies; 2. Demonstrate and critically analyse legal foundation of the EU external competences; 3. Show their awareness of the impact of the EU external policies on third countries and to express their opinions on that; 4. Demonstrate and apply further development of key skills in relation to complex legal techniques, particularly, research, accessing electronic sources, problem solving and analytical skills.

## Course Requirements

Course readings are listed in the course outline below. Students will be responsible for reading the required material prior class sessions. At the end of each lecture, the extra reading for the next week might be announced. Students are requested to actively participate in all open format discussions, group workshops and assignments/exercises and to follow the current news related to the content of the course as developments occur during the year. A paper is required from each student before the end of this course and is expected to be of a graduate student level quality (in approved academic format and fully and correctly footnoted). **Plagiarism (or cheating on exams) will not be tolerated and will be rewarded with a grade of zero points.** For the detailed information on the National University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy's (NaUKMA) antiplagiarism policy look at the NaUKMA's web page. ## Assessment

Grading will be based (30%) on a research paper covering various contemporary topics in area of the EU External Relations Law within the framework of the course and upon a choice of students. Research paper (max. 5 000 words with the title page and bibliography, 1.5 line spacing) will be due before the last class. Active participation in the class including individual presentations will be worth 30% of the final grade. In case student has acquired 60-70% of the final grade he/she could be automatically awarded with grade “C” according to the ECTS scale. The final exam will be given in a short essay format and will make up the other 40% of the grade. Students will be graded in line with the ECTS standards (A, B, C, D, E, F) using 100 points scale.

Grading of the research paper and presentation will be based on the following criteria: 1) relevance of the research question to the course and application of various methods of legal research – 10%; 2) analysis of relevant EU and national case law – 10%; 3) academic structure and quality of presentation – 10%.
